One2One – Israel-North American high school exchange

- This last quarter, and for the first time, ENTER's One2One, together with the Israeli Ministry of Education and RootOne LLC, launched two Winter/Spring cohorts for 4,000 North American and Israeli teens to meet for five online, one-on-one sessions. The updated content includes thought-provoking materials about Jewish life in Israel and North America, Jewish experiences and values, and mutual responsibility (*arvut hadadit*).
- In addition, ENTER launched a One2One cohort, with support from the Jewish Federation of Greater Washington, targeting Jewish high school students in the Washington, DC area. Some of the day school students participated in longer *mifgash* sessions that allowed for Hebrew conversation alongside One2One's core emphasis on English language skills and Jewish peoplehood themes.
- As part of this Federation partnership, ENTER staff visited a number of area synagogues and schools and held an open house in a community member's home in Silver Spring, Maryland for partner schools and prospective parents.



One2One – Israel-North American high school exchange

- Representatives from the Washington Federation spoke with Israeli One2One participants while visiting the Pirchei Aharon School in Kiryat Shmuel.
- Unistream, working with youth in Israel's geographic and socioeconomic periphery, incorporated One2One as a pilot program in their English excellence track.



“Peoplehood Infused Schools”

- ENTER’s Peoplehood Infused Schools program this year includes 12 schools. All the participating schools have started the second half of the school year with ongoing activities.
- Dr. Yizhar Hess, Vice Chairman, WZO - Israel, spoke at a training session for 50 educators from a Peoplehood Infused School in Ofakim about Jewish Peoplehood.
- In partnership with the Nadav Foundation, ANU - Museum of the Jewish People and WZO - Israel, schools participating in the program have already started educational museum tours of ANU - Museum of the Jewish People. Students and teachers are learning about Jewish communities and traditions from around the world. This year, over 2,000 students and teachers will visit the museum as part of the program.
- Peoplehood Infused Schools participated in Jewish Diaspora Week. The schools highlighted different communities and held a special Diaspora day with students and parents.





North American Jewish Peoplehood Coalition

- **Leadership** - In February, [members of the Coalition](#) met with Israeli counterparts in Jerusalem around the Conference of President's Israel Mission. Representatives from Hadassah, JWI, Rabbinical Assembly, AZM, and others participated.
- **Master Class** – In March, the URJ hosted the Coalition's quarterly hybrid "Master Class" which gathered nearly 25 organizations to discuss new peoplehood data, insights from Israel and spotlight a new educational framework with presentations from Tracy Frydberg (ANU), Nila Rosen (FJC) and Rabbi Josh Weinberg (URJ). - **ANU/Coalition partnership** – During Q1, the Coalition embarked on a partnership with ANU to co-sponsor a late April workshop in Tel Aviv focusing on millennial public policy professionals.
- **The Peoplehood Paradigm** – Dr. Scott Lasensky published ["Choreographing Peoplehood: 2022 Peak Moments"](#) in the Times of Israel in early January.





Dare to Ask

- ENTER launched 'Dare to Ask,' a new project with The Jewish Federation of Palm Beach County. 'Dare to Ask' is a video series showcasing Israelis answering anonymous questions submitted by North American Jews on a variety of important, yet sensitive topics, including minorities in Israel, Judaism as a whole, the Arab-Israeli conflict and more.
- In the last few weeks, the team has been selecting questions sent by North American Jewry, launching the program's Instagram page, casting Israelis to answer the questions and filming the series.
- On March 27-28, the team held two intense filming days featuring interviews with 18 Israelis representing different factions of Israeli society. Stay tuned for the series' official trailer in a few weeks.





ENTER at 2023 Jewish Funders Network International Conference



- On March 19, 2023, The CRB Family Foundation sponsored a reception highlighting the work of ENTER at the Jewish Funders Network international conference in Phoenix, Arizona. Co-founder, Jeffrey R. Solomon, and Founding CEO, Alon Friedman provided brief remarks about the governance, current activities and future goals of ENTER to funders, foundation professionals, philanthropic advisors, and organizational leaders.
- Jeffrey R. Solomon moderated a conference session about the relationship between Jews in Israel and the Diaspora, featuring Irina Nevzlin, Chair, Board of Directors, ANU - Museum of the Jewish People, Zack Bodner, President & CEO, Oshman Family JCC, and Rabbi David Fine, Trustee, Fine Family Foundation.
